Goal 1: What Is Copyright?

Federal and international protection of original works

Protects Original Works

Written (paper or digital) Graphics Websites Video Sound recording Computer programs/apps

Protects Holder's Rights

Exclusive rights to:

Sell/distribute/reproduce the work

Publicly display the work (e.g., a recorded PPT)

 Prepare derivative works (e.g., translations, future editions, modified graphics, training modules)

Authorize others to do such things

How to Copyright a Work

Works are automatically copyrighted when 'fixed' in tangible form

Does NOT require:

Publication
Copyright notice (©)
Registering for copyright



Works For Hire

For works created as part of job duties, the employer is the copyright owner --- not the creator

Cornell



Pesticide Safety Education

Industrial, Institutional, Structural and Health

Termite Control



Commissioned Works

The creator or creator's employer is the copyright owner --- <u>not</u> the commissioner of the work (unless expressly agreed to otherwise in writing)

Covers most grants, contracts, etc.

Federal Works and Grants

No copyright on any work of the U.S. government

Federal grants and contracts with non-federal creators

Seek university legal counsel


Possession ≠ Copyright

 Artist retains copyright after selling painting
 License agreement only provides permission for stated use(s)

Benefits of Honoring Another's Copyright Extends professional courtesy Provides acknowledgement Points others to the correct source in seeking permission Assures you're not in violation of U.S. Copyright law

Fair Use: Does Not Violate Copyright

Includes: criticism, comment, news reporting, teaching, scholarship, or research

The more you use, the less likely it applies

Does not cover commercial uses

Not as broad in practice as appears

Acknowledgment ≠ Fair Use

Acknowledgment avoids plagiarism, not copyright infringement

Goal 4: Is Copyright Practical in C&T?

Copyright Allows Sharing

 Maintain mutually beneficial sharing of materials with other states

Be fair to your applicators and protect your investment

Licensing Agreements: Cornell Example

Licensing Agreements: Cornell Example

Have allowed some other states to adapt a manual

 Only if will not interfere with our multistate sales

Licensing Agreements: Cornell Example

Signed license agreement

In-state use only

One edition only

Proper acknowledgment

Negotiated fee (bargain rate)

Basic Understanding

 State uses Cornell manual as is
 PSEP or SLA can develop training aids based on Cornell manual provided they do not replace manual sales

Permissions Beyond Copyright

Get permission from person or property owner before using photo you took

- Courtesy: respect privacy
- Photo might reveal something you didn't notice
